
The support services offer appropriate support and liaison with local professionals and organisations focused around the ten outcomes of the **Mental Health Recovery Star**:



Annie had spent over 20 years in a restricted secure unit, followed by an admission in hospital which lasted for over 3 months. She has now found a home at PendleView, but after years of institutionalised care she had lost the ability to care for herself. With staff support, she is enjoying cooking meals not only for herself, but other service users. She has also found a new skill in ironing and is learning new things on a weekly basis. The staff team feel that with the right support and encouragement, Annie should be able to move to Potens local supported living accommodation. "I had spent most of my life in hospitals, moving from one area to another, now my home is Pendle View where I am learning new skills all the time"




Calder View & Pendle View
