Wearing a school uniform also means that pupil's own special clothes do not get dirty or damaged during the busy school day, an anxiety that many of our pupils have.

All of our pupils spend time out and about in the community. It is important during this time that pupils are clearly identifiable as school children who are with a school group, a teacher, or their school support team, and wearing their uniform supports this.
