- Social worker and olive tree helped me re-gain (my) family relationships and I moved back in with my Mum.
- · Helped me gain confidence
- Socialised
- · Created timetable of activates I liked
- Encouraged and rewarded good behaviour
- My general health and wellbeing improved.

Chapter 2 - My first Year

What did you do in your first year?

Alec wrote – (I) got back on my feet accepted support, attended activities, became a lot less moody/anxious (and) created positive relationships.

Did you feel support helped you and why?

Yes, without the support I wouldn't be where I am now. I improved my life in all areas through positive role model staff who helped and encouraged me to not neglect my needs, create meaningful activity timetable, my mental health improved. I was less anxious and I didn't feel alone anymore. I had friends and family again, I felt safe and wanted again.

The next few years

How was support did it help with home life?

Yes, My relationship with family members improved, I then settled in with my mum living there for a few years. I felt a lot more settled, and part of the family again.

Chapter 3 – Thinking about moving

Did you want to move at first?

It took Alec many years to consider moving on and accepting that this was the next positive step in his life. Alec enjoys his own space and his own methods and sometimes living with his mum was a struggle for both, for example, Alex didn't like Christmas and Christmas decorations, yet His mum was the opposite and this at times caused conflict. Alec then had a very short period of time where he lived with a girlfriend at the time, but when that didn't work out, this made him realise he was ready to move out of the family home. Alec said Yes, I had previously lived with my girlfriend after my mums. Alec then moved into a flat owned by another service.

Ok, as I still have my family support.

Do you feel you have benefited from moving?

Yes, as I love my own space, I have my own flat that I am very proud of.

Yes, I'm living independently, paying my own bills, cooking for myself and currently waiting to start a new voluntary job. I feel the most independent I have ever been.
