We have exciting news! Maen are hatching chicks again this Spring!

We placed the eggs, from a staff member's chickens, into the incubator, on the 5th of March. They take 21 days to hatch, just in time for the Easter holidays. There are 10 eggs and we check them every few days to make sure they are growing well.

In order for the chicks to grow, we need to keep the chicks at a specific temperature and humidity, so we must check the eggs quickly and return them to the incubator.

We visited the Weymouth Sea Life Centre to see some of the sea creatures we've learnt about.



It was lovely to meet so many parents during Open Week. It was a great opportunity to deliver a Thrive taster session. We provided refreshments and the children baked some delicious cakes.

The Thrive approach centres on the emotional well-being and development of children. Parents learnt about the 'Jenga Tower' which is a metaphor for all the developmental building blocks that children create as they grow and experience life. Due to many factors that life brings and developmental stages of children, some of these important blocks are missed or knocked out. In the session, we discussed how we adapt our actions and language register at school to help children cope and move forward; along with talking about some of the activities we do with the children to help rebuild those blocks.
